Solidarity Economy

Solidarity Economy is a social movement which struggles for changes within the society and to get over the capitalism, founded on the democratisation of the economy by way of the production and reproduction of the life in a fair, solidarity-based, self-managing and sustainable way.

Solidarity Economy is expressed within the initiatives of collective organisation, such as productive groups, non-profits and cooperatives, and is known also as solidarity economy enterprises, which are operated within the sectors of rural and urban production, of services, of consumption, of education, of culture, of solidarity finance and of fair trade. Other contributions for the development of solidarity economy come from civil society organisations (such as NGOs, foundations and other entities) and public administration organs which put into practice promotional actions in the emancipatory perspective and in the organisation for the self-management work.

We're together in networks and linkage forums of these workers all over Brazil with performances at international networks.

We invite all of you to see our history and to get involved with solidarity economy to build up the Buen Vivir.

The expression Buen Vivir is of Native Latin American origin, within the holistic comprehension of the life in harmony with the nature, in the quest of the balance between the human being and the environment in order to reinforce the commons, of the culture and its identities in a holistic way. It starts from the perception of interdependence of the life, preserving the universal principles and values within the construction of communitarian systems.

We understand that the solidarity economy favorises the buen vivir, in the sense that its practices aim for the happiness and the warrant of respect for fundamental rights on the basis of the collecctive organisation and the valorisation of the diversities, to the 'integration to the environment and to the equality between women and men.
